### Wildfire Update

### WILDFIRE UPDATE JULY 10, 2017 AT 4:00PM STATUS IS HIGH

There have been 175 wildfires in the High Level Forest Area this wildfire season, all but five of which have been extinguished.

Great progress was made on the fires that were discovered yesterday and as of this afternoon, three of them have been extinguished and two are being held.

HWF 172 is located 20 miles north of Rainbow Lake and is now being held at 2.0 hectares in size.

HWF 174 is located 15 miles north of Meander River and is being held at 7.40 hectares in size.

### **SMOKE CONCERNS**

Smoke from the wildfires in British Columbia is expected to continue to affect the High Level Forest Area. You can monitor the smoke forecast site to keep informed on expected smoke dispersal. If you have health concerns associated to air quality, such as asthma, try to avoid spending time outside until the situation improves.




