- Roku (requires an internet connection)
- Apps on SMART TV (requires an internet connection)

For our valued customers, we have waived the disconnection fee for our cable service. When you drop off your equipment, you will need to sign a disconnect form and inform the staff what you would like done with your deposit. You can have your deposit issued the following ways:

Development Permits

Just a reminder that our Land Use Bylaw requires development permits when there is a change of use to a parcel of land or if the footprint of the land changes . This means for all the mobile homes that are being sold and removed from parcels of land, we do need to have a development permit submitted to the Town Office. The permit is completely free and is used as backup to let our assessor know when the building was removed from the parcel of land. This will help ensure you receive an accurate Tax Assessment and Notice. If no paper work is filed, we have no backup to send to our assessor. This also helps to ensure that the water and gas meters are safely removed prior to the mobile home leaving town. If you require a development permit, please stop by the office to obtain one or call the office at 780-956-3934 and we can email you one.
