# Snow Clearing Policy

Now that our airport has changed certification to become a Provincially Registered Aerodrome, The Town of Rainbow Lake's Snow Clearing Policy has changed. Here is some important information:

#### **POLICY NO. 31-001**

- **5.3** Unless unusual circumstances or additional snowfalls otherwise interfere:
  - a) Priority 1 will be cleared within 8 hours
  - b) Priority 2 and 3 streets will be cleared within 24 hours, and
  - c) Priority 4 (Airport) will be cleared within 48 hours of the start of the Snow clearing activities.
- **5.4** The order in which Priority 2 & 3 streets are cleared may vary throughout the winter season to allow for all side streets to receive snow clearing on an equitable basis.
- **5.5** Should another snow fall occur before all streets are fully cleared, clearing operations will start again with top priority streets.
- **8.2** The Town-owned walking trail will be cleared of snow and ice as time permits during winter operations. The clearing of the walking trail is the last priority for the Public Works Winter Maintenance Staff.

Our crews work very hard every year to get the snow removed as quickly and efficiently as possible. Please keep in mind that if new snow starts to fall, they will have to revert back to Priority 1 and start over. Please drive with caution, give yourself enough time to stop at all intersections and please be aware of all your surroundings!

#### **WHAT IS PFA?**

PFA is an internationally recognized method of support intended to help people during and immediately after a disaster or emergency (including a pandemic). It uses a holistic, community wellness approach to help reduce levels of emotional distress for individuals, families, and communities through practical care, compassion, connection, and support from others.

#### **PFA TRAINING**

PFA training is an interactive 3-hour webinar adapted from the 6 hour in-person training. The training aims to share knowledge, teach skills, build confidence, and increase capacity to support people in the face of a disaster or emergency.

#### **Objectives:**

- Understand the timing of interventions for disasters and emergencies.
- How to utilize the PFA Action Principles in virtual environments.
- •Identify and provide practical support to those in distress.
- $\bullet \mbox{Understand when to refer people to appropriate community supports. } \\$
- Explore self-care strategies for disaster response.

# Property Taxes

This is a friendly reminder that all 2022 Property Taxes must be paid by December 31, 2022 to avoid entering arrears with the Town of Rainbow Lake. Any Property Taxes left unpaid from before December 31, 2021 will be registered with the province in 2023. Any Property Taxes left unpaid from before December 31, 2020 will begin the process of tax sale proceedings.

If you aren't already part of our Property Tax Pre-Authorized Monthly Payment Plan, you might want to consider setting it up at the office. No penalties will be levied against your property for outstanding balances during the year (some restrictions do apply).
