

Tri-Council is seeking assistance to gauge the interest of the region in submitting a bid to host the 2026 Alberta Winter and/or Summer Games. Tri-Council is composed of the Town of High Level, Mackenzie County and the Town of Rainbow Lake. This event would be a collaboration of the region, not just one community. The economic revenue from hosting an event such as this would benefit the region.

Before pursuing a bid, Tri-Council would first like to determine the level of interest from local businesses, non-profit and community groups. Hosting an event of such magnitude relies heavily on commitment from many volunteers, sponsorship support, suitable venues for sporting events, accommodations for lodging and food services for approximately 3,000 athletes, coaches, officials and spectators.

Peer Support

Alberta Health Services • Addiction and Mental Health

“**PEER SUPPORT** is a helping relationship between a client and support worker that promotes respect, trust, and hope which can empower individuals to make changes and decisions to enhance their life.

Typically, the person will be struggling with addiction or mental health to be accepted in the program, but all referrals will be considered.

How can Peer Support help you?

- ♥ Assisting with locating and connecting to resources.
- ♥ Provide connection to community either individually or within a group.
- ♥ Walk alongside you as a non-clinical support by listening to your story and empowering you by using a self-directed, strengths-based approach to enhance your life.

HOW TO CONNECT TO SERVICES:

A person can self refer, be connected through a health care professional or community agency. Complete referral form provided by the Peer Support Team. This is a basic form requesting general information. This can be emailed, faxed or picked up from the Addiction & Mental Health Office at the Northwest Health Centre in High Level. Once completed, the Peer Support Team will review the referral and connect with the potential client to confirm if the Peer Support program is suitable for them.

Peer Support can be offered as a stand-alone service or in conjunction with other approaches to service delivery. It is used to address the limitations of services provided by the health care system. The focus is non-clinical, mutual support empowering the service—user and centred around holistic care rooted in the lived and living experience.

The service is designed to minimize power imbalances and fosters equal and empathetic relationships, encouraging people who are coping with challenges to make decisions that are based on their own knowledge and expertise about their own needs.”
