Emergency Preparedness

As we have reached the one year anniversary of the Long Lake Wildfire, it is important for us all to remember that given the drought conditions we have been experiencing, we must be prepared for this wildfire season. While you can be assured that there are many eyes on both the Long Lake wildfire and Basset complex, and current conditions have been favorable, fire danger can increase quickly with warmer temperatures and lower humidity. To help mitigate the stresses this fire season may cause, now would be a good time to get your household ready for the wildfire season if you haven't already started. Here are a few things to get you started:

- Develop a family emergency plan so everyone knows what to do in the event of an emergency.
- Keep your important documents together and easily accessible in the event of a emergency evacuation. (Passports, birth certificates, health cards, insurance, etc.)
- If you have pets, make sure their carriers are easily accessible and your family has a plan in case of an evacuation.
- If you are financially able, keep your vehicle full of fuel.
- Keep an emergency kit in your vehicle including an extra phone charger.

Property Taxes

The 2023 Property Taxation and Assessment Notices were mailed out early this year on April 8th. If you are a property owner on the Assessment Roll for the Town of Rainbow Lake, you should have received your notice. If you didn't receive your notice, or if your notice contains incorrect owner or mailing information, please contact the Town Office and provide the correct information.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding the assessed value of your property, please contact the Town's Assessory Aaron Steblyk of Compass Assessment Consultants Inc. at

If speaking to the assessor does not resolve your concerns, you may appeal your assessment in writing pursuant to section 460 of the MGA. Assessment complaint forms are available at the office as well as on the Municipal Affairs website.

On the complaint form, you MUST provide reason(s) why you believe the information shown on the Assessment and Tax Notice is incorrect. An Assessment Review Board hearing date will be set after the final complaint date.
