Congratulations to Maureen Leptich on being the 2021 Volunteer of the Year!!


With the COVID-19 restrictions lifting, we were able to hand deliver the award along with the certificates. Keep up the great work everyone!!!

Gas Riser Project

The town has initiated a program to safely handle the gas risers on vacant lots. Arrangements can be made through the town to remove the riser back to the property line, cap it and make sure it is ready for the next time gas services are required to the lot. The Town has negotiated a rate with our contractor of \$600/riser and will pay 50% of this amount under this program. This service is being offered to residents for \$300.00 per riser. There are 2 benefits for going this route:

1. It will eliminate the \$15.00 per month gas riser fee.
2. It will greatly diminish potential liability that you as a landowner could face if something were to happen to the riser.

If you choose not to go this route, the gas riser fee of \$15.00 per month will continue and as the landowner it will be up to you to ensure that the gas riser has been secured properly. Securing the gas riser would include covers and barriers to prevent any damage be they from natural elements or human activity (snowmobile etc...).

Please contact the town by calling 780-956-3934, if you wish to have your property added to the Riser Removal List. Once the work is done you will receive an invoice from the town for \$300.00 + \$15.00 GST for a total of \$315.00.



Tree Removal

In response to the last few winds storms that have hit and caused damaged to our town, we are asking that any residence that has a damaged/fallen tree that is threatening and/or damaging infrastructure, to please notify the Town Office. You may contact the Town Office anytime between 7:40am-4:30pm, Monday-Friday by calling 780-956-3934 or by email admin@rainbowlake.ca

Once the office has been notified, we will send someone over to inspect the damaged/fallen tree. Once the inspection has been completed and approved, arrangements will be made to remove the tree to prevent future damage to any infrastructure.
