Water Treatment Update

RE: ODOR & TASTE FACTORS IN TOWN OF RAINBOW LAKE TREATED WATER

"The odor-taste factors in the treated water the Town of Rainbow Lake is experiencing is a nuisance but it is not harmful. We are meeting the parameters on turbidity, disinfection and biological parameters. The odor/taste is related to two factors: the warmer temperatures we have recently experienced and the Total Organic Carbon (TOCs) elevated levels in the raw water, which is a remnant factor from the 2023 wildfire, effecting our raw water sources up on the headwaters.

I have completed several small increases with chemical dosages and the reactor has responded positively to these changes. The UVAs (UV Absorbance) are monitored on a daily basis in the raw water, reactor water and on the treated water side also. These changes will take some time to be noticed in the Distribution System as with larger systems the turnaround time is gradual. I am confident we can improve it—to what level, I am unsure as I am dealing with a moving target and it is not an item that is often dealt with in water treatment. Total Organic Carbon is difficult to manage at the levels we are experiencing and it is not a topic that is taught in Water Treatment Courses. Many operators and water managers have never dealt with it and as I have 32 years in this career, this is my first time of interacting with it. I have taken training in Total Organic Carbon and how to manage its effects since mid-January from the University of Waterloo and Alberta Environment. There are many unknowns even among the experts as this is new territory for all of us. I have been working very closely with the University of Waterloo and Rainbow Lake is a test subject—the information that is collected from here will become a model for future post wildfire watersheds throughout North America.

We have an excellent monitoring program that was formulated in the winter and implemented when the raw water commenced flowing, along with top of line water treatment chemicals and rest assured the research for better ways to manage the Total Organic Loading will continue. In the headwaters that I manage, we have Tolko coming back this upcoming winter to remove additional burned timber within the vicinity of our creeks and ponds.

There is no timeline for when Total Organic Carbon levels will decline in the raw water sources, only a strict monitoring program that I have implemented will reveal when levels will decline.

At the present, the odor-taste issue is improving here in the plant. This process will take some time and it may not be perfect, however it is what we are dealing with at the present, when I review other recent models, we are performing above average compared to other sites that have dealt with Total Organic Carbon problems."
